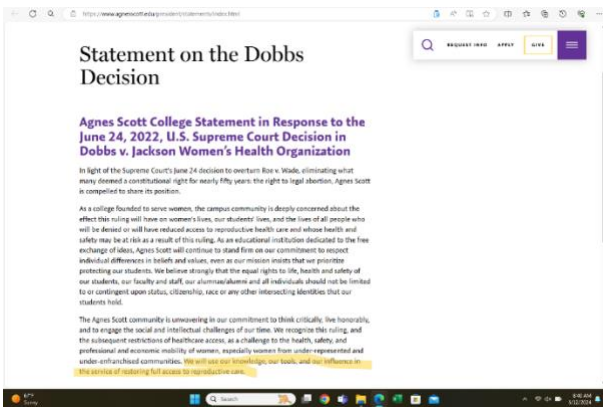
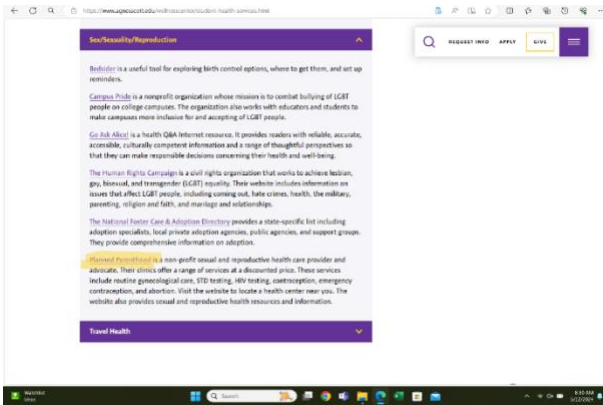

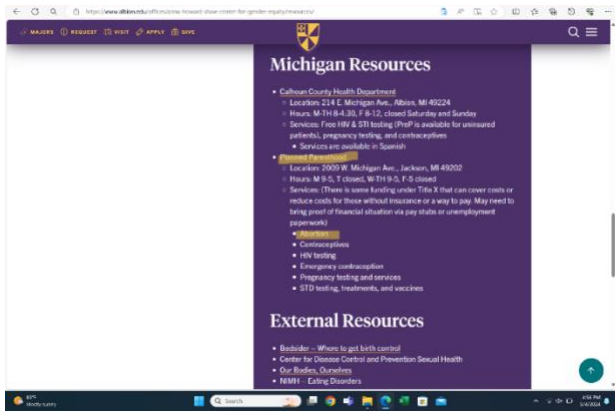

Field Studies

The Albright College sociology and anthropology department hosts a variety of opportunities for field study. The sociology department takes advantage of the potential for hands-on learning within the City of Reading, and the city, in a way, functions as a natural anthropological laboratory. Students have worked with faculty to assess local social issues; agencies, study changes in neighborhood experiencing reinvestment, explore the impact of hydraulic fracturing (fracking) on communities, measure gang involvement and risk factors for gang membership, interview community members on their power relations, and compare religious services, among others.

- Conducting research in the same field also provides immediate feedback on how they compare to what students already know about their own, or other, research in the area.

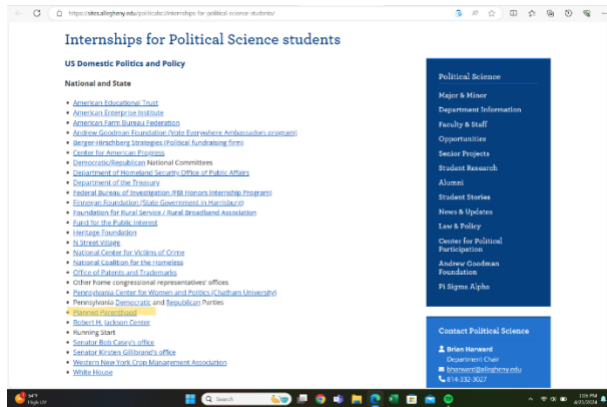

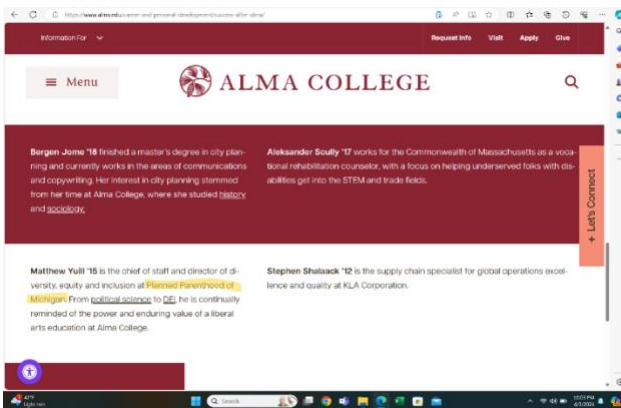

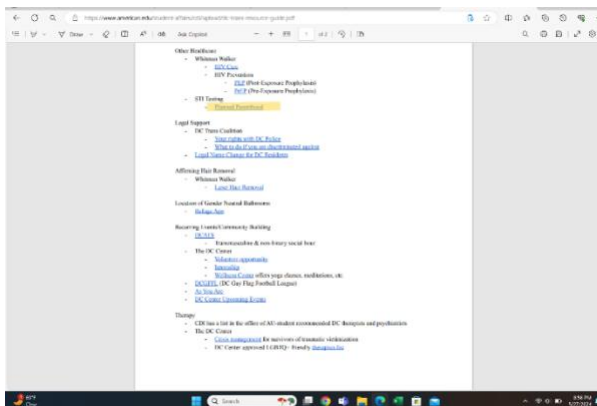

What is a GYN Exam?

A gynecologic exam involves an external and internal physical examination of female genitalia. Additionally, a breast exam is often performed for a more comprehensive woman's health evaluation. A GYN exam generally includes testing for sexually transmitted infections as well as a Pap Smear (see below). You can make an appointment for a GYN exam online or by calling the Student Health Center. Be sure to specify that you would like a GYN exam because these exams are scheduled more times than a routine visit.



Fetal Personhood and Advance Healthcare Directives

APC's professor and producer shared expert analyses legal and health consequences of recent setbacks on reproductive rights.

April 20, 2023

On February 16, the Alabama Supreme Court ruled that embryos created through in vitro fertilization (IVF) should be considered children, undermining the national pro-Dobbs Jackson debate on reproductive rights. As part of this dialogue, SPA Professor **Justice Waters, J.D.** has partnered with SPA graduate student **Morgan Adams BMS, '23** to publish an article in *The Conversation* on the issue of advance healthcare directives (AHD) and pregnancy.

"All of these issues are tied together," said Waters. "Just Dobbs, we are seeing increasing attacks on reproductive healthcare rights, with efforts to not only rescind fetal personhood, but, in the case of Alabama, **entirely personhood**. My decision like that of the Alabama Supreme Court impacts every other state of disempowering."

Waters' research, which focuses on reproductive rights law and policy, has been published widely, including in the *Harvard Journal of Law and Gender*, and she is a frequent media expert and commentator. At SPA, she currently teaches a course on reproduction and the law, as well as SPA-GTS Changemakers Series: Reproductive Justice.

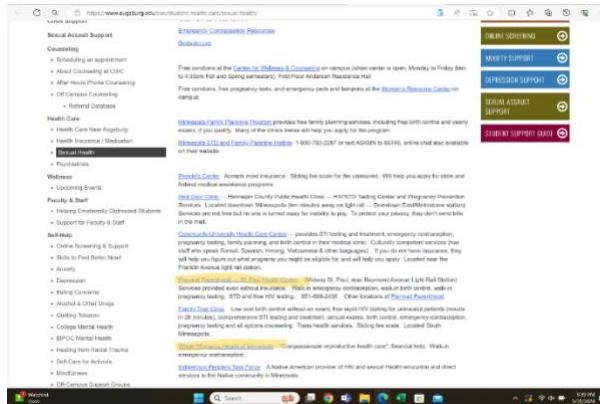

Since the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Center* last June, lawyers, health care providers, and pro-life advocates are actively working to understand access to abortion care in a post-*Dobbs* world. The latest of these events and reproductive health care was the focus of a panel on April 26.

On April 26, two attorneys from Planned Parenthood League of Massachusetts (PPLMA) joined an event hosted by the Public Interest Law Foundation, O'Connell Law School Students for Reproductive Justice, and the Children's Rights Group.

In a conversation entitled "Reproductive Rights and the Constitution," Betha Reardon, Director of Health Policy and Government Research at PPLMA, and Marybeth Harney, Director of Planned Parenthood's Center for Health Policy and Government Research, provided a historical overview of the constitutional right to abortion and discussed how reproductive law Planned Parenthood are engaging abortion care in light of the *Dobbs* decision.

The second half of the presentation included a student writing exercise, designed to help students better understand the process for writing effective laws. Attorney Marissa emphasized the critical importance of state health care efforts to protect abortion rights in a post-*Dobbs* world.

The following day, picking up on the theme of state-level reproductive rights policies, O'Connell Law School and the Health Law Society hosted a second event with the Center for Reproductive Justice. The discussion from the recent meeting raised a group of about thirty students and faculty for a briefing on the recent case, *Allison v. Planned Parenthood of Ohio*. The *Allison* and *Ohio* Administrators v. *Planned Parenthood of Ohio* decision that consolidated the *DOH* 2009 approval of medication, use of the drug used to abort medication abortion in the United States.

Valeri Roman and Lucy Whaley began with an overview of the case and the procedural questions, highlighting the fact that the court's decision in *DOH* approval was a "normal" approach that could have very similar implications for abortion rights elsewhere. They then discussed the legal issues, the recent Supreme Court stay of the Fifth Circuit decision pending an appeal, and what individual states are doing to prepare to ease the decision in ultimately upheld.

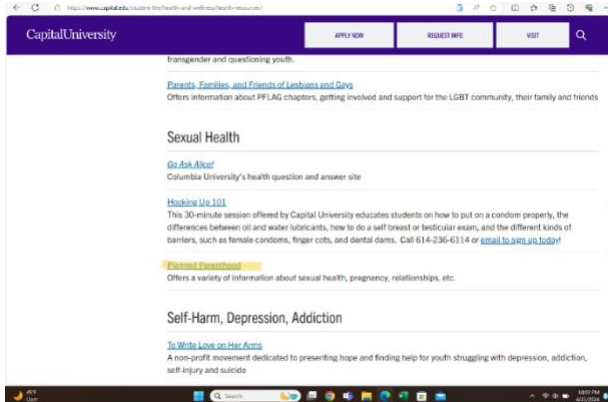
Though both events highlighted the uncertainty around abortion access, they also emphasized the importance of political engagement and state-level policy efforts in protecting reproductive rights for all.

On June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court overturned the 1973 landmark decision, *Roe v. Wade*, that protected a person's right to choose to have an abortion, upheld for nearly 50 years. The *Roe* decision rested on the "right to privacy" guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment of the Constitution. [The latest Dobbs v. Jackson](#) [reversed the constitutional right to an abortion](#).

What does this mean exactly? To explore what this decision means and where we go from here, visit the [William Carlos Coker Center](#) and [James Lovelace](#), the Provost's Office, and the Fowler School of Law sponsored a campus-wide conversation with faculty experts on June 28. The Ask the Experts panel included [Professor Maria Ciaramita](#), Dean, Fowler School of Law and Day and Dee Hester Chair in Law; [Dr. Lori Cox Hen](#), Professor of Political Science, Day H. Hester Chair of American Presidential Studies, Director, Presidential Studies Program, and Co-Chair of Threat; Associate Professor of History. The panel was moderated by Executive Vice President and Provost, [Dr. Norma Bouchard](#).

"While the Constitution doesn't specifically use the words 'right to privacy,' which is a more inclusive phrase, everything that protects centers around that concept," said Professor Ciaramita.

Dr. Cox Hen, whose research and teaching expertise include the presidency, women and politics, media and politics, and political leadership, said the Supreme Court's decision is out of line with the majority of Americans on this issue, and they are on the wrong side of history. "Public opinion is totally against what the Supreme Court did."

Dr. Threat focused on the intersection of class, race, and reproduction rights, noting that "the decision to overturn *Roe* will disproportionately affect women of color and low-income women, who will continue to bear the burden of both the lack of access to adequate health care and who already suffer higher rates of maternal mortality."

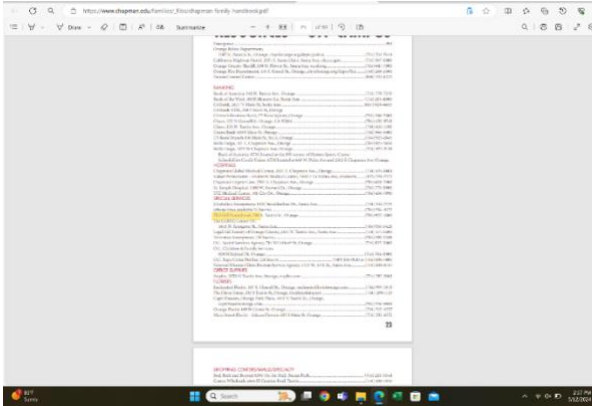

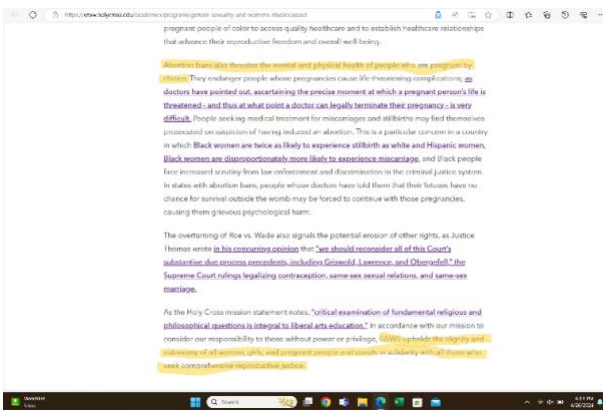

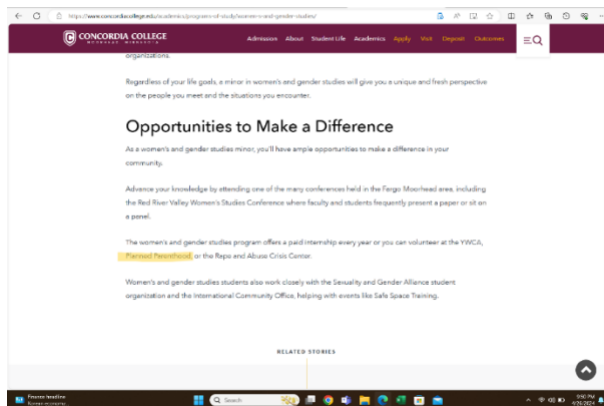

Medical follow-ups

- Within 72 hours an individual can be treated prophylactically for certain STDs and pregnancy (if that is a concern). Most hospitals offer this treatment, in Cedar Rapids Cady Point Health St. Luke's Hospital and Mercy Medical Center offer emergency pregnancy prophylaxis. Most physician offices, [Huron Parish](#) and The Emma Goldman Clinic can also provide this treatment. There may be a charge for this service. Also important is follow up testing for STDs such as HIV.

Mental health follow-ups

- On-campus free, individual counseling is available to individuals accused of sexual assault, to help deal with feelings related to being accused, decision making, and exploring behaviors such as alcohol use. If appropriate, a referral to an off-campus mental health professional may be provided. You might prefer to help an accused friend by being with them when they schedule for first visit. Support groups for those accused of assault may also obtain counseling from the Center. For more information call ext. 4302 (315-895-4793).

Through a partnership with the Family Planning Council of Iowa we are able to provide [emergency contraceptive](#) (morning after pill) for free that contains condoms, 2 doses of plan B, and 2 urine pregnancy tests, and printed education materials.

- Pregnancy testing is available at no cost to the student.
- Individual boxes of plan B (free morning after pill) available for purchase in the health center. Cost is \$10.
- Health and counseling staff are able to work with students and refer them to an appropriate community resource if they have questions about terminating a pregnancy.

Off-campus providers and care

- For students wanting and contraceptive, IUDs and other birth control measures, we manage referrals to local providers in Mt. Vernon, Cedar Rapids, and Iowa City. Printed materials with all the contact information are available in the center.
- As with all medical appointments, campus safety can provide transportation in Mt. Vernon.
- For any student with a medical appointment out of town, they may complete a ride request form at [Huron](#) and we will arrange transportation based on driver availability.

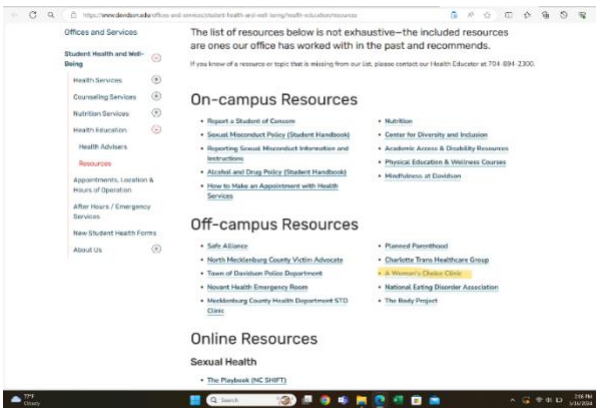
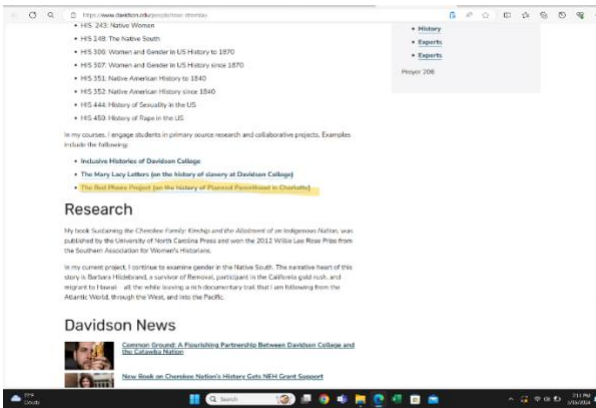
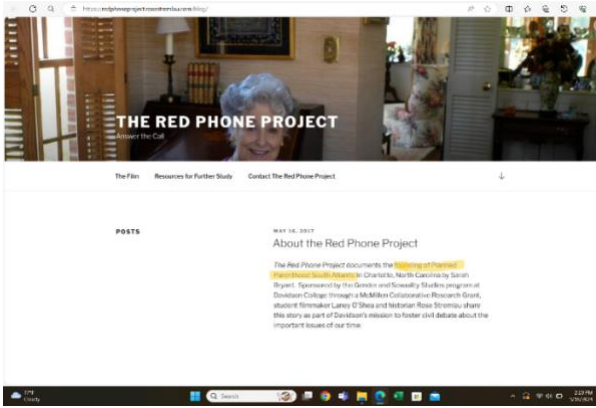
Is there anything you think has been overlooked in the history of Roe and access to abortion?

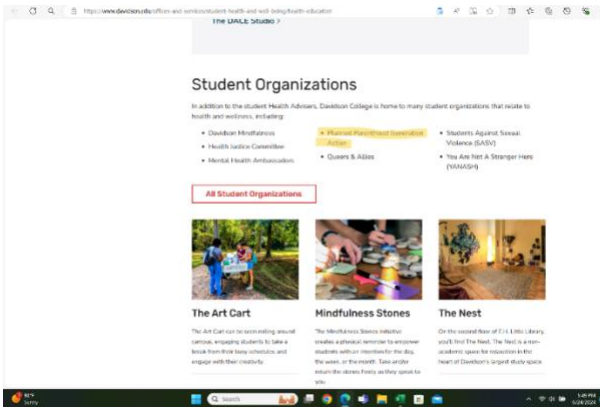
Yes, and I think it stems from a lack of nuanced thinking about abortion access, one that views pro-choice and pro-life as unified blocs. It is not binary. There is a continuum of public opinion that accounts for the timing and the circumstances surrounding access. For example, very few individuals reject all exemptions, such as those for rape, incest or the life of the mother.

Also, the pro-life movement has never been a monolith in its tactics or its emphases. Some groups have advocated against abortion in biblical terms. Other pro-life activists have couched their opposition in legal terms, such as the right to privacy. The group Personhood Alliance has framed arguments by claiming life begins at fertilization and views "unborn human beings as persons deserving of equal protection and due process under the law." Whether the concern is with heartbeat legislation or the concept of "personhood," you can expect an ongoing effort to increase the inventory of restrictions against access to abortion.

Finally, very few people understand that overturning Roe or dramatically curbing it is not the end of the story. Groups such as Americans United for Life have an inventory of pieces of legislation to cement a pro-life culture even in states with trigger laws. These include a Human Cloning Prohibition Act, an Abortion Inducing Information Act, a Pharmacist Freedom of Conscience Act, an Unborn Infant Dignity Act, and a Suicide by Physician Act. **There are but a few examples of the efforts to increase the scope of limiting abortion even without Roe.**

When the draft opinion was leaked, it pushed the abortion debate back to the top of the political agenda, if only for a



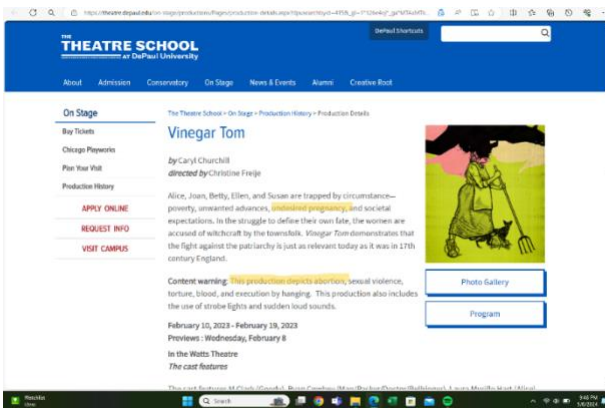
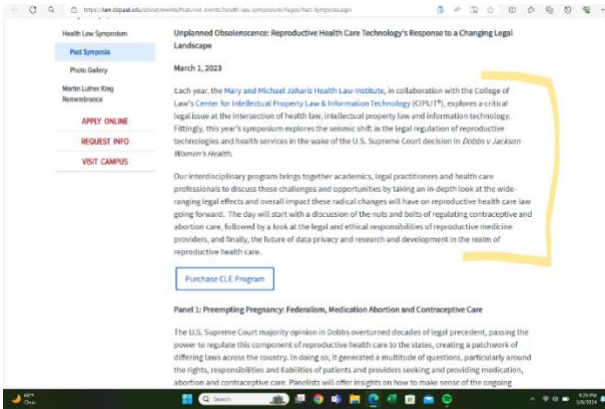

NEW ORLEANS Dillard University will hold its inaugural Women's Health Conference June 29-30, 2021. Themed "Women's Health Across the Life Span," the two-day conference will be held virtually and it is being hosted by the University's College of Nursing and Minority Health and Health Disparities Research Center. Clinicians such as physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and allied health professionals are encouraged to attend. The conference is also for researchers, health educators, public and community health leaders, and students who have an interest in women's health and grant writing.

The purpose of the conference is to call attention to the disproportionate health issues that women must manage such as emotional and behavioral health, cardiac disease, reproductive health and breast cancer. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, heart disease is the number one cause of death among caucasian and African American women, and the prevalence of the disease increases as these women age. Although African American people account for only 13 percent of the U.S. population, 43 percent represented newly diagnosed HIV/AIDS cases in 2018.

According to conference co-coordinator and Dillard nursing professor, Dr. Charlotte Hurst, citing the CDC, "African American mothers are dying at three times the rate of non-Hispanic white mothers with older African American women over 40 having the highest rate of all maternal deaths." Hurst looks forward to conference-goers increasing their knowledge in three areas: the number of health care issues impacting women across the lifespan, resources and treatments for health care issues impacting women and the grant writing process and procedures for completing grant applications.

The conference will feature a presentation by New Orleans Health Department director, Dr. Jennifer Avegno who will also moderate a panel discussion entitled "The Impact of COVID-19 on Women in New Orleans." Also, several experts and practitioners will present their abstracts. The keynote speakers will include Dr. Edith Mitchell, clinical professor in the Department of Medicine and Medical Oncology at Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University and Dr. Elizabeth Ofili, professor of medicine at Morehouse School of Medicine and a practicing cardiologist with Morehouse Healthcare.

Individuals to follow their personal religious and moral convictions regarding their reproductive healthcare. We continue to stand by this conviction today. This religious and moral agency includes the autonomy of birthing people to decide whether to complete or terminate a pregnancy.

Our Synod resolutions, which represent the will of the church in light of scripture, highlight the importance of ensuring access to the full range of reproductive health care regardless of race, religion, or economic status. We do not take this stand in spite of faith, but rather because of it. Throughout sacred text humankind is tasked with care of self and others. **Bodily autonomy is a human right given by God.**

Today's Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, overturning nearly 50 years of precedent, will endanger the lives and well-being of birthing people who do not choose to continue pregnancy. God loves and cares for people who have abortions, and so does the United Church of Christ. We believe all people have the right to make their own decisions about their bodies and medical treatment. We believe women have an inalienable right to shape the direction of their lives as they see fit, and no institution established by humankind should supersede such freedom.

The Supreme Court's decision to vacate Roe v. Wade and return the protection of a woman's human right to states represents a continual effort to oppress women and people who can give birth. Such uniform repression targeted at one specific class of people, namely those who have a uterus, creates yet another stark division in a country that so desperately needs unity. In addition to gender bias, such a rendering also disproportionately affects birthing people of color and women in rural or low-income areas who face challenges in access to safe and medically supervised reproductive health care, including abortions. The gravity of this decision and the devastation of its impact cannot be overstated.

Through the prophet Isaiah, God offers these words of comfort to the Israelites during a challenging time: "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41:10) These are not words that assuage us with easy answers and shallow promises. There is no declaration that things will be better tomorrow. They will not be. But they do promise that we are not alone in our struggles.

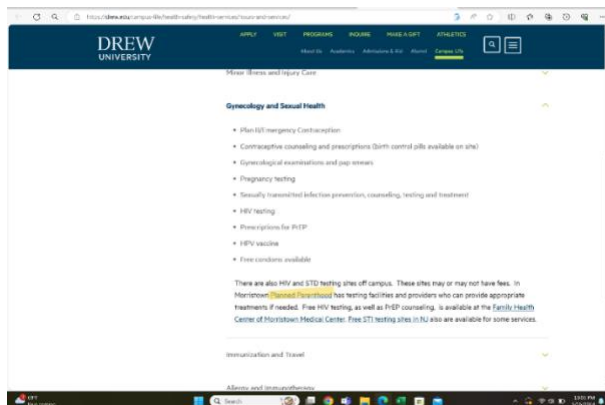
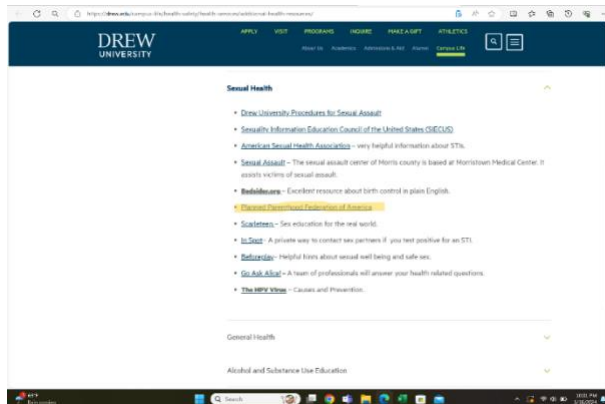

President Vincent E. Price released the following statement regarding the reinstatement of North Carolina's ban on abortions after 30 weeks.

Abortion is both a health care procedure and a profoundly personal and highly political issue that prompts deeply held and conflicting convictions on our campus, in our community, and across our country. With that in mind, I want to reaffirm Duke's core responsibilities to serve our students, faculty, staff and patients.

As an educational institution, Duke has a responsibility to advance learning within an environment of respect and inclusion. We must recognize that many of our students, faculty, staff and neighbors have experienced fear and uncertainty about their future access to reproductive health in the wake of the Supreme Court's Dobbs decision in June—uncertainties that this reinstatement are likely to deepen. Let us remember to approach one another with compassion in this uncertain moment.

As a health system that serves tens of thousands of residents of North Carolina and the southeast, Duke has a responsibility to provide high-quality and often lifesaving patient care, promote health equity, and support patients in making health decisions with their doctors. **Duke Health will continue to provide reproductive health services, including abortion, in compliance with state law.**

Finally, as an employer and campus community, Duke has a responsibility to support the wellbeing of everyone who comes here to learn, work, teach, and live. We remain committed to providing access to reproductive health services, including abortion, to our students, faculty, and staff. We do not plan or anticipate any changes to this commitment following the reinstatement.

Duke is above all a community of extraordinary people: colleagues and classmates who deserve our respect, empathy, and care. In the months and years ahead, these principles will continue to guide us on this issue and many others.

Project Description

The aim of this project is to document the political and ethical situations of Southeastern reproductive healthcare providers as they attempt to provide women and pregnant people with the nationwide medical standard of care in the aftermath of the Dobbs ruling. The combination of Duke University Hospital's unique geography, located in one of few southern states now permitting abortion, with its institutional structure (private rather than public) make it an ideal place from which to study healthcare and reproductive rights in the national post-Roe landscape.

Team members will document the effects of the new legislation on reproductive healthcare providers, as well as the consequences for patients' health. Using ethnographic methods including compiling oral histories, gathering and organizing archival research, documenting media coverage and conducting interviews. Team members will create an audio and documentary archive chronicling the work of the Family Planning Services team of Duke University Hospital.

This archive will include short audio and video narratives that will be considered in the context of historical and contemporary reproductive healthcare. The goal of the archive is to present qualitative data to inform healthcare policy, law and media coverage in the continuing post-Roe era.

Could you share details about the MOOC that RISE launched this year?

We are excited to announce the development of **Abortion History, Access, Policy, and Practice**, a free, open-access MOOC. This introductory public health course provides accessible and foundational knowledge on the topic of abortion in the context of a changing reproductive health landscape in the U.S., with some overview of the global context. Highlighting expertise from RISE and Emory University researchers and community partners, this course provides an introduction to abortion from public health, medical, policy, social, and human rights perspectives for general audiences. MOOC topics include: **discussion of global abortion care, abortion access, abortion policy, abortion history, and the importance of evidence-based learning.** Learners will benefit from diverse learning opportunities through lectures, online resources, and self-reflection activities.

What should the public know about access to medication abortion at this current time?

As of April 15, 2022, medication abortion (mifepristone) in the U.S. is still legal. However, access to medication abortion is not uniform in a coordinated, systematic effort to restrict access to abortion in the U.S. to the greatest extent possible. However, three judicial processes are ongoing, with additional developments expected in the coming days or weeks, including the potential for the case to go to the U.S. Supreme Court. Legal experts ultimately believe the final decision for enforcement rests with the FDA. A summary of recent judicial rulings is as follows:

- Friday, April 7
 - U.S. District Judge Matthew Kacsmaryk ruled in *AFM v. FDA* blocking the FDA to stay mifepristone's approval.
 - U.S. District Judge Thomas G. Howe ruled in a separate case blocking the FDA from making any changes to mifepristone access in 17 states and the District of Columbia.
- Monday, April 10
 - The U.S. Department of Justice appointed Kacsmaryk's ruling, calling it "extraordinary and unprecedented."
- Wednesday, April 13
 - The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that the FDA's initial 2000 approval of mifepristone could

GSR5 and the Office of DJS Statement on Dobbs v. Jackson Ruling

Dear Community,

On June 24, 2022, we woke up to a different world: a world in which a majority of sitting U.S. Supreme Court justices had turned their backs on more than fifty years of legal precedent to dismantle the constitutional right to privacy and bodily autonomy. **The SCOTUS ruling on Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization has resulted in a significant and concerning loss of reproductive autonomy.** Abortion care is now illegal in nine states in the U.S., and 17 additional states are expected to ban or significantly limit abortion access in the coming months.

These historic changes to federal and state law will affect close to half of all women and menstruating people living in the United States. Yet we know that these effects will not be distributed or experienced equally. The Dobbs v. Jackson ruling will disproportionately harm communities of color, people living in poverty, and trans and non-binary people.

This ruling is about much more than what Andrea Smith calls the "liberal statecraft" of a narrow right to choose versus the protection of fetal life. It is about whose rights are deemed worthy of protection under the U.S. Constitution. It is about how pregnant people and healthcare providers are targeted for criminal prosecution or civil penalty. It is about the failures of our nation-state to support all parents and all children's access to equitable healthcare and other basic human needs like food and shelter.

We, as faculty and staff of the Gender, Sexuality and Race Studies Program and the Center for Diversity, Justice, & Sustainability, reject this wrongful and persecutory decision. We affirm the basic human right for all people to determine their own lives and govern their own bodies. We support a reproductive political movement that goes beyond the pro-choice / pro-life divide to instead embrace reproductive justice for all. Scholars and activists LeVana Ross and Shikha Dholger define reproductive justice as:

(1) the right not to have a child, (2) the right to have a child, and (3) the right to parent children in safe and healthy environments. In addition, reproductive justice demands U.S. racial autonomy and gender freedom for every human being.

As educators in academic, co-curricular, and community settings at PLU, we believe that education is an essential tool for both engaging and actively fighting back against this new world. We encourage members of our community to seek out accurate sources of news and information on reproductive justice and healthcare access, such as the [Dobbs v. Jackson Ruling](#), the [Center for Reproductive Justice](#), and [Reproductive Justice](#). In turn, we must attend equitably to the ways in which this ruling intersects with histories of white supremacy, homophobia, and anti-trans culture and policy. A directed internship in which students integrate their academic study of gender issues with practical experience in an campus organization, agency, or business (75 hours per week). 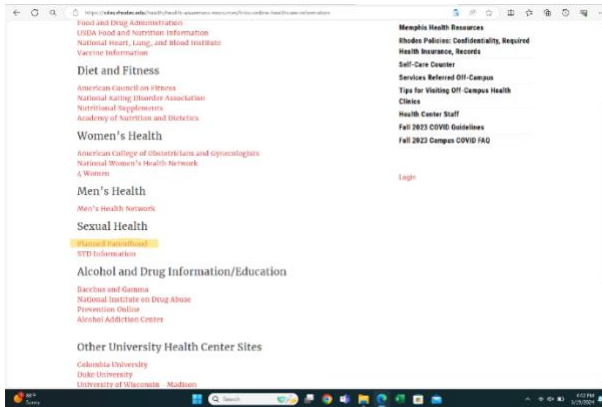
Psychology internships are offered for academic credit and are designed to provide students with the opportunity to gain practical experience in their preferred area of interest. Students may enroll in 2-4 credits of PSYC 480, and are expected to spend between 8 and 12 hrs per week on their internship activities over 10 week semester. Each year, between 10-20 majors (graduate persons and junior combined) participate in a variety of placements including the 70+ year Children's Museum of Memphis, Lubbock Children's Hospital, Youth VM Main, [Hennepin County](#) Hospital, Care Net, Memphis Healthcare, various law firms, and business research organizations of area businesses.

Goals of the Program

The primary goal of the Psychology Internship Program is to allow Honors students to integrate what they have learned in an academic setting with relevant experience in a business, service agency or educational institution. You can talk to your provider for things such as thinking you might be pregnant, needing birth control or Plan B (morning-after pill), thinking you have an STI (sexually transmitted infection), needing information about alcohol, tobacco, or other drug use,
